



Year 2 Homework Overview

We suggest the following as good practice:

Year 2 – To read their school book or another book every single day at home for around ten to twenty minutes. Discuss the way we read punctuation as well as words, how bold or italic words are read differently. Look for how advanced punctuation is used. For example, speech marks, brackets, commas, apostrophes etc. It is very important that adults discuss these things with their child as they are not likely to notice them on their own. In addition, a weekly SPAG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar) activity will be set alongside weekly spelling practice. In Mathematics, by the end of year 2, all children need to learn their 2x, 5x and 10x tables fluently. Your child will be set a Mathematics activity weekly, focusing on building upon basic arithmetic skills and consolidating timetables.

Occasionally children will be requested to complete Project work. This will allow children to develop their creativity in how they wish to present their work and give them some freedom in developing the aspects of the research that particularly interest them. Within project work, children get the opportunity to develop their creative interests.

Spelling

Spellings alongside their spelling rules are taught weekly. Children will be given weekly spellings to practise at home alongside consolidating their understanding of the spelling rule focus of the week. There is an expectation that the children should be using these words, spelling them correctly within their written work as they continue to develop a rich and broad range of vocabulary. Alongside the

national curriculum statutory spellings for each year group, classes will also learn and develop their understanding of key vocabulary linked to topics across the curriculum. Children will have a spelling test each half term.
